AT THE CAPITAL.

Debate of the Senate and House of Representatives.

Resolution Adopted to Consider the Herioton Tariff Bill—Bills of Various Kinds and Discussions Thereon.

WASHINGTON, April 14.—The Senate passed the naval appropriation bill, with amendments for the construction of cruisers and for the preparation of plans and estimates for an armored vessel of 5,000 tons displacement. A petition was received from Mrs. James A. Garfield and 200 other citizens of Cleveland, praying that the New York be returned to their home. A favorable report was made on the resolution granting certain publications to the Christiana and law library. Bills were introduced to place the President on the United States and the United States on the Northern Pacific road. Several sections of the bankruptcy bill were considered.

The House of Representatives held a conference on the bill for the relief of the insolvent debtors, which was adopted, directing the committee on agriculture to inquire into the introduction of the foot-and-mouth disease in Maine through the oversight of Federal officials and to report thereon within three months for the purpose of preventing the disease. Further introduced a bill for a tariff of 3 per cent. on iron and steel, and of 10 per cent. on iron, iron ore, and iron castings. A bill for the relief of the insolvent debtors was introduced in committee of the whole.

WASHINGTON, April 15.—The Senate passed the joint resolution to furnish certificates to the law library of Connecticut. Bills were formally reported to create a commission on the alcoholic liquor traffic, for the relief of the New York Indians at Idaho, and to provide for the duties of the branch mint in Denver. A resolution was offered directing the judiciary committee to report whether the United States marshal at Chicago should be removed from office on account of his commission being revoked. The bankruptcy bill was taken up, and it was agreed that a person owing in excess of \$300 may petition for discharge.

The House representatives, by a vote of 146 to 118, resolved to consider the tariff bill in committee of the whole. The bill was reported by Messrs. Morrison, Kelley, and Mills. 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MORE SOUTHERN CYCLONES.

A Tornado in Georgia—A Terrible Storm in Texas.

CHERRY, Ga. April 14.—A disastrous cyclone swept over Harris county. The wind-storm struck Chappel about 2:30 a. m. The first damage done was at the residence of George Williams and Mrs. Robb. Five miles northwest of Chappel, and from there to Mr. Collier's and Mr. J. Jenkin's place, where the houses were blown down. Lee Alford was instantly killed at the latter place, and his wife and three children badly hurt. Alford's body was found 150 yards from the house.

The destruction of property can hardly be estimated. The crops swept everything in its path away. Many precious objects were carried off.

VALENTIA, Minn. April 15.—The town of Blackhawk, within twelve miles of here, was struck by a cyclone. W. W. Brewster and C. Crispin dwellings and out-buildings were totally destroyed. Brewster's daughter was seriously hurt.

DALLAS, Tex. April 15.—A terrible storm has visited Dallas and the surrounding country. It was very early in the morning, when suddenly it became exceedingly dark, and it was necessary to light lamps. A strong gale from the north accompanied the storm for a space of about fifteen minutes. The colored church at the corner of Hill and Jolly streets was wrecked. The building was blown out and a noble free school for colored children in the fifth ward was blown to a young colored woman Mrs. Clara Williams. There were thirty-two children in the room when the cyclone struck. In the building when the cyclone struck, the same darkness filled the teacher and her pupils with alarm. Suddenly there was a loud roar, and the frame building began to tremble. "We must get out of here," all rushed for the door, crying with fright, but before they could make their exit the wind caught the house and, shaking it to the ground, making a total wreck of it and catching a number of children in the streets. Several were killed, and many were injured. The cyclone was also fatal, and the teacher was also hurt.
