VOYAGE OF A BUOY. From Off Fort Hayes, S. C., to the Bermuda, and St. John's, N. F. An interesting instance of the strange wanderings of derelicts at sea is furnished by the Atlantic coast chart. On Nov. 26, 1890, the Fort Hayes, a coastwise steamer, was on a voyage of adventure off Charleston harbor. Drifting into the Gulf stream, the vessel was carried by the current in a zigzag course, probably under the influence of conflicting winds. It was last seen that year in the Gulf stream on Dec. 15. The vessel was discovered floating serenely along in good condition, off the eastern edge of the Gulf stream some 200 miles north of the Bermudas. This is a distance of more than 1,000 miles, and during the month of May voyagers along the coast were told of the Bermudas, passing only a short distance from those coral islands. It was not until the vessel was sighted, but although it had been in sight of the track of the great hurricane. It turned up in good shape on June 9, 1891, 400 miles northwest of the Bermudas. Here it seems to have found a part of the coast to its liking, for it remained in that neighborhood, always drifting, and several times recrossing its track, but never venturing more than a hundred miles or two in any direction, for two years. It was seen by passing vessels on several occasions during this time. Finally it started off again toward the south, and according to the latest ad-vice, Sept. 12, it had gone some 100 miles before the latitude of the Bermudas, but keeping 500 or 600 miles to the eastward of the islands. The wanderer was still in good condition when last seen. The latest four years' voyage of the buoy has been a most interesting one for the light that it throws upon the old stories of drifting reliefs having been carried from America to the coasts of the old world before Columbus sailed.
