Mr. Charles A. Ruffin is again in charge of affairs at White Earth Agency, having returned upon the duties as agent yesterday. Mr. Ruffin years ago proved his adaptation to the duties of Indian agent, and his return gives general satisfaction.

Now that the legislature is about to meet, it may be confidently expected that several cranks will commence to turn on the subject of the proposed amendment to the constitution that the republican party should elect severally alone.
