Minutes of School Meeting, Oct. 11, 1895.

The school meeting was called to order by F. T. McCallan and J. Palmer was chosen chairman and A. W. Miller clerk. The first thing in order was the reading of the financial statement of the school district by the treasurer, T. J. Nary, after which a motion was made and carried that the report be approved as read.

Reports then followed by Mr. Nary and Mr. McCallan. Mr. Nary reported that the school law was being enforced by Mr. Bryant and also by the chairman, F. T. McCallan.

A motion was made by J. Collins that the chair appoint a committee of three to report the cost of running the district for the ensuing year. The motion was seconded and carried.

A motion to take a recess of fifteen minutes while the committee were making their report was carried, the committee being Messrs. Nary, Hardy and Haldet.

At the end of the recess the following was called to order and the following report of the probable expense for the ensuing year was presented:

For teachers	\$500.00
For incidentals	50.00
Total	\$550.00

The money for school purposes for the ensuing year in the county treasurer's hands being \$8,800.

After the report was read the committee was discharged.

A motion was then made to levy a mill tax. The chair appointed Mr. W. Hall and E. L. McCallan as assessors. A motion was then made on the above motion was taken reported 65 votes in favor of levying a two mill tax and Mr. Hall 54 votes against it. A motion was then made by Mr. McCallan and seconded by Thomas McGuire that the vote be annulled by Mr. Hardy and seconded by C. Jones to vote by ballot. Mr. Haldet moved that the ballot be "tax—yes" "tax—no." A motion was then made by Mr. Hardy that all voters be subject to challenge. The result of the vote was 66 against tax and 65 for it.

Discussion was then opened in regard to a school board and a motion was made by F. L. McCallan and seconded by Sam Smith that the old board be retained. This motion was annulled by C. P. Potter and seconded by Sam Smith that the old board be elected with the exception of Mr. Nary.

The matter of fixing up the sleeping apartments of the city firemen at the central house was left with S. F. Whelan, and he was instructed to see to it that the same were granted an extension of time.

A bill of \$20 which was allowed A. F. Ferris, was referred to the electric light committee.

The application and bond of Fred Benkman for liquor license was read, bond approved and license granted.

Ordinance No. 119, amending ordinance No. 70, relating to and regulating sewer connections had its first, second and third readings and was adopted.

Petition from property owners asking that a sidewalk be laid on the corner of Second street and Fifth street was read and referred to the electric light committee.

Petition from citizens asking that an iron light be placed at the corner of Second street and Fifth street was read and referred to the electric light committee.

Motion was made and seconded that the city engineer and street committee be authorized to set aside monthly \$400 collected from the electric light contractors. Council adjourned.
