Careful experts have concluded that silver has been used in the world in actual value, and it is a matter of some doubt whether there has not been produced at a low rate. The "ratio" of the two metals has greatly varied. In ancient Arabia silver was the greater value, but since the sixteenth century the ratio has varied from 7 to 1 to 16 to 1.
