CHAMBER OF THE COMMON COUNCIL. CITY OF BRAINERD, JAN. 18, 1873. At the evening session of the Common Council of the City of Brainerd, January 18, 1873, the following communication from L. P. White, Esq., President of the Council, and acting Mayor, was received and read: Brainerd, Jan. 18, 1873. To the Hon. The Common Council of the City of Brainerd: It becomes my painful duty to announce to your honorable body, the sudden demise of M. Tuttle, Esq., Alderman from the First Ward of said City, which transpired at 5 o'clock A. M. this morning. In doing this, I can but suggest that such action shall be had as shall express the sentiments of respect, and esteem, in which Mr. Tuttle was held by this community, and the regrets you must necessarily entertain at being deprived of the wise council and admired fellowship of one so generally beloved by all his associates. Respectfully submitted, LYMAN P. WHITE, Pres't of the Council, Act'g Mayor.

Ald. Heathcoat then paid a high tribute to the integrity, ability and high character of Mr. Tuttle, and offered the following resolutions, which were unanimously adopted: Whereas, Our Infinite Father, in the supremacy of his all-wise providence, has this day called our beloved colleague, Mr. M. Tuttle, into his higher council.

Whereas, In this untimely loss to us and to this community, we deeply feel the full significance of the sudden and serious dispensation, and Whereas, It becomes this council to pay its tribute to the well earned reputation of Mr. Tuttle, for great moral worth, strict integrity in all business relations, and noble manhood in all circumstances of life. Therefore, be it Resolved, That in respect to his memory, this Council do now adjourn until Thursday evening, Jan. 23d, 1873, and that the members do attend in a body, the funeral of our beloved colleague; and that we tender to Mr. Tuttle's relatives and friends our heartfelt sorrow at their sad and sorrowful bereavement.

ORDINANCE NO. 1.—An ordinance to regulate and license the sale of Spirituous, Vinous, Fermented, or Intoxicating Liquors, within the limits of the City of Brainerd. The Common Council of the City of Brainerd, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person or persons applying for license to sell spirituous, vinous, fermented, or intoxicating liquors, within the limits of the City of Brainerd, before the same is granted, shall pay to the City Treasurer the sum of Fifty Dollars, and upon receipt of the same, and executing and filing his bond with two or more sureties, to be approved by the Council in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars, conditioned that the person so licensed will not sell or otherwise dispose of any spirituous, vinous, fermented, malt or intoxicating liquors, other than at the place designated by said license; nor on the Sabbath day, or evening, nor after Twelve o'clock at night, and until daylight the succeeding day, nor keep upon such place of business any person, other than a clerk, or thing, nor on any general or special election day, nor to minors, or any person of unsound mind, nor to an habitual drunkard, nor to any person or persons, after notification by or to his or her or their relatives, or writing, by his or her or their relatives, or the Chief of Police of said City, not to sell to him, her or them, and that he will in all respects observe a quiet and orderly house, and not permit or suffer any cards or any other device, for money or the representative of money, in the house or place of business of such person, the Mayor shall issue a license as to such person or persons, stated to be granted for a less term than one year, and all licenses shall commence and terminate on the first day of May, of each year; provided that there shall be no transfer of said license—nor the place of dealing in liquors, as designed therein, to be changed, without the consent of the Council thereof.

SECTION 2. Upon conviction before a court having competent jurisdiction, of any person or persons, for violating the conditions, or either of the conditions of the bond mentioned in the preceding section, the Council may revoke any license so granted.

SECTION 3. Any person or persons, selling, bartering, vending, trafficking or dealing in, or giving away any spirituous, vinous, malt, fermented, or intoxicating liquors, contrary to the provisions or conditions of Section One of this ordinance, or without first having obtained a license to sell, barter, vend, traffic or deal in spirituous, vinous, malt, fermented or intoxicating liquors, shall, for the first offense, upon conviction thereof, be punished by fine in a sum of not less than Fifteen nor more than Fifty Dollars, and for each subsequent offense, not less than Twenty-Five and not more than One Hundred Dollars, or imprisonment in the County Jail, not less than Ten days, nor more than Thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

ORDINANCE NO. 2.—Ordinance prohibiting disturbance of the Peace, and drunkenness.

The Common Council of the City of Brainerd do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person or persons who shall make any boisterous noises on the streets of the City of Brainerd, to the disturbance of the inhabitants of, or other persons in said City, or who shall engage in any riot, disturbance or improper diversion, to the annoyance or disturbance of the citizens of, or other persons in said City, and all persons who shall congregate in bodies, or crowds in said City, for any unlawful purpose, to the annoyance of the citizens or other persons, shall for each offense, on conviction before a City Justice of Brainerd, be fined in a sum not exceeding Fifty dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding sixty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. Any person who shall be found drunk and disorderly, within the limits of said City, to the annoyance or disturbance of the citizens of or other persons in said City, shall upon conviction, be fined in a sum not exceeding Fifty dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding Thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

ORDINANCE NO. 3.—To prevent the careless use of Fire-arms, Crackers, etc.

The Common Council of the City of Brainerd do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever shall carelessly use, or discharge any pistol, revolver or cracker, within the limits of the City of Brainerd, or discharge any gun, pistol, revolver or fire-arms, on the public streets, or other public places, within said city, shall, upon conviction, be punished by fine not exceeding Fifty dollars, for the first offense, and upon conviction for a second offense, shall be punished by fine not less than Ten nor more than Fifty dollars, and by imprisonment not to exceed Thirty days.

ORDINANCE NO. 4.—Ordinance to prevent indecent exposure of person, or conduct, and lewd conduct or obscene or filthy act, or the exposing for sale of lewd books, &c.

The Common Council of the City of Brainerd do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who shall appear in any street or public place in said city, in a dress not belonging to his or her sex, or in any indecent or lewd dress, or shall make any indecent exposure of his or her person, or be guilty of any obscene or filthy act, or of any lewd, indecent, immoral or insulting conduct, language or behavior, or shall exhibit, sell or offer to sell any indecent or lewd book or picture

or other thing, or shall exhibit or perform any indecent, immoral or lewd play, or other representation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not exceeding One Hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding Thirty days.

SECTION 2. Any person who shall inhumanly, unmercifully, cruelly or wantonly beat, injure or otherwise mistreat any dumb animal within the city limits, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Fifty dollars.

ORDINANCE NO. 5.—Ordinance to prevent Gaming and Gambling.

Whoever shall keep any house, room or place, for the purpose of gambling, or use and occupy, or cause to be used or occupied, any Faro, or Roulette tables, Faro banks, devices used in the games of Keno, Mustang, Vingt-et-une, Chuck-a-luck, Wheel of Fortune, or any other device or device whatsoever, for gambling purposes, or whoever shall suffer or permit any gaming table, bank or gambling device, prohibited in this ordinance, to be set up or used for the purpose of gaming in any house, room, tent, booth, or building, to him belonging, or whoever shall bet any money or other property at or upon any gaming table, game or device, prohibited by this ordinance, or whoever shall deal cards, or use any device or device in and about gaming of any kind, or keep any devices designed to be used in gaming as herein prohibited, shall, upon conviction, be punished by fine not exceeding One Hundred dollars, nor less than Twenty-five dollars for the first offense, and by fine not exceeding One Hundred nor less than Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment not more than three months, nor less than one month, or by both such fine and imprisonment, for each subsequent offense.
