The position of general manager of the Northern Pacific railroad has been offered to Mr. H. E. Sargent, formerly general manager of the Michigan Central railroad, and that gentleman has gone East to accept the position. This is an excellent appointment, as Mr. Sargent is a railroad man of vast experience and of great energy, and his appointment shows that the directors of the road are determined to have a man at the helm, whose standing and ability will satisfy the public that they really mean to push the road forward to completion as early a day as possible. The annual meeting of the directors of this road was held in New York on the 26th of last month, when the change in the management was decided upon. At the meeting a report was submitted which strongly urged that congress be petitioned to pass a bill extending the time for the completion of the road to the Pacific, and show the advantages to accrue to the country by its construction. A resolution was adopted that the construction of the road westward from Bismarck should be forthwith commenced, and eastward from the Columbia river as soon as practicable.
