JAY GOULD'S international railroad, which is designed by the diplomatic capitalist to unite the two republics will be hands of iron, being built toward the border at the rate of two miles per day.

Loose financial management is alleged against the secretaries of the American Bible society, by the executive committee of the Connecticut Bible society, to which the assisted secretary strikes back and asks a suspension of judgment. If the charges are true, even in substance, there should be a suspension of sympathy.

The Nebraska Ed. Williams aptly remarked to the sheriff of Hall county that "there are a heap of people who look like the Williams boys and they haven't got all of them yet." It may be that they haven't any of them yet, but from the details of the Nebraska affair it appears that they have really bagged Ed.

The value of the new underground telegraph system of Germany was strikingly demonstrated during late disastrous gale. While business in England and on the continent was largely suspended in consequence of interruption in the telegraph service by prostrated wires, German cities were able to communicate with each other as usual.

When congress meets, December 4, the house will consist of 146 republicans, 138 democrats, eight greenbacks, two readjusters and one independent. After the result in Virginia it is believed the readjusters can be safely relied upon to vote with the republicans on the question of organization, thus giving that party a majority over the combined opposition.

The Salt Lake Tribune is authority for the statement that Confederate bonds are being manufactured by the million in Utah from newly-made plates. The story goes that the plates were made in Chicago. By the time the eccentric London gentlemen who are purchasing bonds of the deceased Confederacy finish their labors they will probably discover that the job which they undertook was more exciting than lucrative.

The surprise over the result of the New York election increases as one thinks of it. That state has been almost invariably democratic on all years during the last two decades, only rising to the level of a republican victory on the state ticket when there was an excited canvass, an absorbing issue at stake, and a full vote polled. With these conditions present on Thursday last, the state was handsomely carried by the republicans in spite of internal dissensions, which most predicted would result in republican defeat.

In the classic shades of Deadwood the average voter is not very choice in reflecting the language used in advertising a runaway wife. The notices are usually written and posted in the post-offices and saloons, where they will catch the eyes of a majority of the population. A recent one runs as follows: "My wife Sarah she was Shook my ranch. When I didn't do a darned thing, too hard and I want it destitely understood that any man that takes her in and keeps her for on my account will get him pumped so full of lead that Sum tenderfoot will locate him for a Mineral claim. If she runs Hur face fur erode I won't put up for her, an' I'll tick the son-of-a-bitch that takes her stand-off even for the drink, a wog to the wife is sufficient an' or'er work on fools too."

A few miles below Otho, Ala., there is an old negro named Moses, who claims he had a revelation from the Lord, in which he received information that the world would be again destroyed by water. He was so convinced that the destruction would be by water that he at once began the work of building an ark. He has been thus engaged for several months, and the result of his labors may be readily seen from the river. This ark is very unlike the representations of the one built by Father Noah, and would doubtless not withstand any severe gales, such as might be expected in a cruise of forty days and forty nights. This oddly constructed vessel or house is placed on a high hill, ready for the rising water. It is composed of several apartments, about five feet wide and ten feet long, which were placed on top of each other. Each has a small port-hole, and spires with feathers as ornaments. Approaching the dwelling of the negro one has to pass through a very elaborately decorated arch over the entrance to which are the words: "Welcome, Peace, Rest and Happiness."
